Hello to everyone from the new guy. November weather provided a good start to the season with over 30 cm of snow. I actually managed to get out on my old skis November 20th. One day of warm rain brought us back to reality. Luckily our great grooming staff managed to roll and pack most trails with the Skidoos to save our snow base. We need a lot more snow before we can get out with the big Bombardier groomer. We have spent a lot of time removing rocks to smooth out and straighten sharp corners on some trails (big improvement on first half of Rabbit.) We have a new renovator to make the trails even better this year.

Our general manager, Ron Earle, has a new office staff in place eager to help members (hopefully over 1000 again) and visitors. The rental room is all

This has created some wide vistas new to our trails. It has also provided some new open slopes for some of us who like to put on some fatter skis and play in the ungroomed deeper stuff. Larry Krar, our snowshoe guy, has worked hard to reroute and mark our snowshoe trails in some of those open spaces. I would love to see more of our skiers on some of the upper trails (i.e. Crystal Rim and High Country.) The views and terrain are great.

Good luck to all our competitive skiers from Telemark and I hope everyone will support their

events this year. I hope to meet a lot of you out on the trails this season. Let's hope we're still skiing in March.

Junior Race

There are 35 athletes in the Telemark Junior Race program this year. They train at Telemark Tuesday and Thursday nights and Saturday mornings under the guidance of Head Coach Adam Elliot.

The race season kicked off in December with backto-back weekend Nor-Am races, first at Sovereign Lake (Vernon) then at Blackjack (Rossland). Our team was represented by Dana Allen, Veronika Dimova, Madeleine Ertel (Juvenile Girls), Gareth Williams, James Sader (Juvenile Boys), Alexandra Myshak-Davis, Mirena Dimova (Junior Girls), Jon Sader (Junior Boys), and Kurt Behnsen (Junior Men). The competition level is very high at Nor-Am races with many skiers from the Canadian National team and the National Training Centers as well as top-seeded racers from all across North America. Our team place well. Gareth and Alexandra advanced to the B-side finals in the sprints in Vernon, and Madeleine brought home a bronze medal in sprints and gold medal in 2.5K free from Rossland.

Upcoming January and February is very busy with a race nearly every weekend starting with BC Winter Games trials on New Year's Day for 13 and 14 year olds – we will have 5 athletes competing. 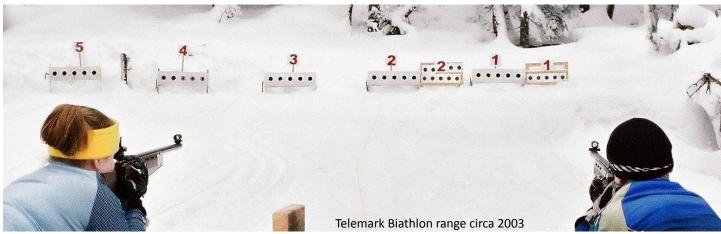

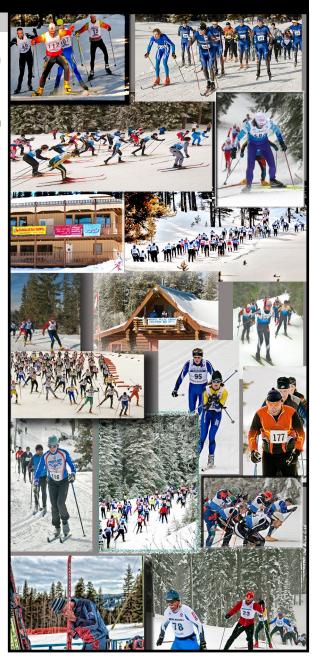
