Driving Directions:

Telemark Nordic Club is in West Kelowna, 9 kilometers up Glenrosa Road, on a paved and plowed road. Go west (up) Glenrosa Road at the Glenrosa Road interchange (at the Gorman Mill) on Highway 97 toward Crystal Mountain. The Telemark parking lot is 3 kilometers before Crystal Mountain. There is a large Telemark sign at the entrance to our parking lot. The Telemark lodge is located 100m from the black parking lot gate. Telemark is a 25-minute drive from downtown Kelowna and 15 minutes from downtown West Kelowna.

The competition office is in "The Fort" (biathlon building beside the range) and will be open from 08:00 on February 3 and 4, 2024.

Notice regarding firearms:

Biathlon rifles are not permitted in the main lodge. Competitors are required to transport their rifles from the parking lot to the biathlon range in either a soft or hard case. Rifles should not be left unattended.

Rifle Import Regulations:

Teams and individual competitors from outside of Canada must declare their rifles at the Canadian border, complete the necessary documentation, and pay the required fees when bringing rifles and ammunition into Canada. All athletes must register their own rifles and pay the applicable fee. Refer to the government website at <https://www.cbsa-asfc.gc.ca/import/iefw-iefw-eng.html> for guidelines.

Rules:

International Biathlon Union (IBU) rules and regulations shall apply as fully as possible to all classes. Specific rules for classes not covered in IBU rules contained in the current Biathlon BC hosting policy shall apply to those classes.

Eligibility to Enter:

All competitors must be registered participants with Biathlon BC or an equivalent Provincial or State organization to enter.

Biathlon BC members in good standing are eligible to receive full benefit of results in Biathlon BC programs, such as BC Cup points, and team or squad selections. Any member of Biathlon Canada or other IBU Nations in good standing may enter but will not be eligible for Biathlon BC programs and awards.

Training:

The range will be open for official training on Friday, February 2 from 11:00. Trail tickets are included with registration for athletes and coaches. Parents/guardians must also purchase a day ticket (online - <https://shop.telemarknordic.com/collections/ski-passes/products/ski-day-pass> or in person) or present a season pass if they plan to ski or snowshoe. If parent/guardians are not skiing or snowshoeing, they do not need a day ticket or season pass.

Volunteers:

We need you! We have many jobs on Saturday, Sunday or both days. Please let us know if you are available to help by registering as a volunteer through the Zone4 registration page <https://zone4.ca/register.asp?id=33648>.

Registered volunteers will receive a trail pass and lunch on the days they are available.

Competition Information

Competition Events:

Saturday

BC Cup classes will compete in a Sprint race with single start on 30 second intervals.

Unofficial categories (U13) will compete in a Sprint race. They will be divided into U13 Prone targets and U13 Standing targets.

Sunday

BC Cup classes will compete in an Individual race with a single start on 30 second intervals.

Unofficial categories (U13) will compete in an Individual race. They will be divided into U13 Prone targets and U13 Standing targets. There will be no penalty loops or times,

but the number of hits will be recorded for each athlete. After the race is completed, the total number of hits will be calculated as a Team Percentage to win the "Skittles Cup".

Registration:

All individuals who wish to attend, including athletes and coaches must register in advance. Finalized registrations are due by Tuesday, January 30 at 23:59 through Zone4 <https://zone4.ca/register.asp?id=33648>. No entries will be accepted after this time.

Entries will be confirmed on February 2, 2024, at the Team Captains meeting.

Entry Fees:

\$40 per athlete per BC Cup competition
\$40 per athlete per competition in U13 categories

Lunch:

There will be CASH BBQ available Saturday for the race patrons.
Volunteers will be provided with lunch free of charge on the days they are registered.

Cancellation Policy:

There are no refunds if a competitor does not show up for the competition. Zone4 processing fees will not be refunded for any reason.

If an athlete withdraws before January 26, 2024 a \$15 processing fee will apply before a refund is sent. No refunds will be given after this date.

If the event is cancelled one week ahead (before January 26, 2024) then the registration fees will be refunded in full. If unforeseen circumstances cause cancellation closer to the event, the organizers may retain entry fees sufficient to ensure no loss against monies already spent.

Trail Passes:

Trail passes for registered athletes, coaches and registered volunteers will be included in registration fees for Friday, Saturday and Sunday. Please confirm your ticket requirements on the registration form. These tickets will be available for pick up at Telemark Main Lodge on Friday, February 2, 2024.

Parents/guardians must purchase a day ticket either through Zone4 registration <https://zone4.ca/register.asp?id=33648> or online - <https://shop.telemarknordic.com/collections/ski-passes/products/ski-day-pass> or in person) or present a season pass if they plan to ski or snowshoe.

Classes of Competition:

The following classes of competition will be run, depending on sufficient entries.

Classes with fewer than 3 registrants may be combined with another class.

Age is as of December 31, 2023.

Competitors in the Masters categories must carry their rifles.

Sr Girls/Boys Categories

Rifle racks will be set up to facilitate independent pick up and drop off of rifles at the entry/exit of the range. The stadium will be set up in this configuration for orientation and practice during Friday's Official Training.

Team Captains Meeting:

The Team Captains meeting will be held on Zoom on February 2, 2024 at 20:00.

Awards:

The awards for each day will be presented in the biathlon stadium following the last finisher.

BC Cup Classes

For the BC Cup Classes, medals for the first 3 places will be awarded in classes with 4 or more competitors along with podium recognition for 4th, 5th and 6th place; in classes with 3 competitors, medals will be awarded for 1st and 2nd place; in classes with 2 competitors, medals will be awarded for first place; and in classes with 1 competitor there will be podium recognition only.

Unofficial Categories

Unofficial categories will be awarded participant medals.

Waxing:

Waxing stations can be set up outside. There is a red fence with electrical outlets next to the grooming shed near the entrance to the parking lot.

Waxing Policy:

The [Biathlon BC May 2022 No Fluoro Wax Policy](#) will be in effect.

- All fluorinated wax products are prohibited for use to prepare skis for competition. This includes Pure Fluoro, High Fluoro (UHF and HF), Medium Fluoro (MF), Low Fluoro (LF), and similarly fluorinated glide waxes, powders, pucks, blocks, liquids and other applications.
- The use of hand structure on skis is permitted.
